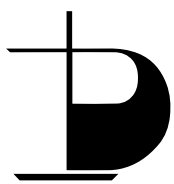

What is Accelerated OYAP Level 1?

It's Level 1 In-class Apprenticeship Training

Accelerated OYAP Level 1 gives students with a passion for the skilled trades a way to fast track their learning and begin the apprenticeship pathway in high school.

Students gain both hands-on learning in a skilled trade Cooperative Education placement and in-class training at a college or union training site to take in-class Level 1 courses.

Students may apply to one of the available Level 1 programs listed in this handbook.

Accelerated OYAP Level 1 students

- Take 4-credit Cooperative Education in the second semester of their graduating year
- Register as an apprentice. Signed a Registered Training Agreement
- Take Level 1 Apprenticeship In-Class Training at a college, union or training centre
- Earn hours towards their apprenticeship training
- Earn up to 4 high school Cooperative Education credits **AND** possibly 2 or 3 dual credits

Registered Training Agreements must be signed by student, parent (if student is under 18) and Cooperative Education employer before the start of Level 1 classes.

AUTOMOTIVE SERVICE TECHNICIAN

An automotive service technician inspects, diagnoses, repairs, and services mechanical, electrical, and electronic systems and components of cars, buses, and trucks.

In this program, students complete an 8-week Cooperative Education placement with a licensed automotive service technician, then attend Centennial College, Ashtonbee College for the 8-week "Level 1" in-school apprenticeship training.

PROGRAM COMPONENTS INCLUDE:

- Cooperative Education in-class preparation for community placement
- A Cooperative Education placement with a licensed Automotive Service Technician as a sponsoring employer; a registered training agreement is required
- Program runs from April – June

This program combines apprenticeship in-class training at Centennial College and provides a Cooperative Education placement in the Transportation Sector in an automotive service industry.

Students in Grade 12 must be in their graduating year with a minimum of 26 credits.

Build up your skills for a strong future

A Brick and Stone Mason uses bricks, concrete blocks, stone, structural tiles and other materials to construct or repair walls, foundations and other structures. They are also responsible for preparing surfaces to be covered and mixing ingredients they'll need like mortar or cement. Preparatory work such as caulking and cleaning and placing damp

Masons.

Masons do a variety of residential work including restoring damaged brick work, putting up ornamental or retaining walls and constructing brick driveways, patios, chimneys, and glass block walls.

PROGRAM COMPONENTS INCLUDE:

- 8 weeks at OMTC to complete the Level 1 training
- 6 weeks at a Cooperative Education placement in the construction industry with sponsoring employer

This program combines Level 1 training at the Ontario Masonry Training Centre and a Cooperative education placement in the industry. It is offered in Semester 2 and is open to students in their graduating year with a minimum of 26 credits.

Earn 2 additional Dual Credits upon successful completion of “Level 1”

Earn a “Level 1” apprenticeship training designation for Brick and Stone Mason

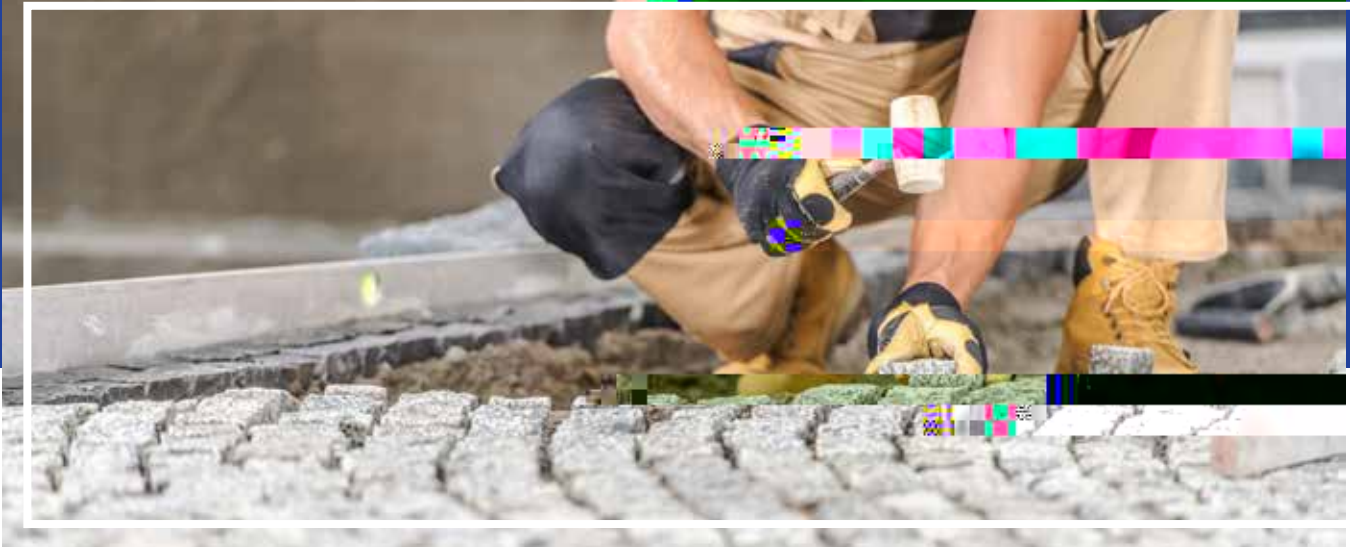

- Earn a “Level 1” apprenticeship training designation as a Construction Craft Worker

TO QUALIFY:

- Be in your graduating year
- Have a strong interest in working with Construction Technology or Technological Design
- Be in good academic standing, including completion of all compulsory courses required for an Ontario Secondary School Diploma
- Be willing and able to arrive punctually at the Training Centre, 8700 Huntington Rd, Vaughan
- Classes at the Local 183 Training Centre run from 7:30 am – 3:30 pm
- Subject to Ministry funding approvals, transportation arrangements and/or bus passes and/or college parking passes may be coordinated and funded
- Have minimum 60% Grade 11 Workplace Mathematics

A Drywall, Acoustic and Lathing Applicator erects exterior structural steel studs and sheathing, shaft wall systems, installs and finishes lath and drywall, partition walls and furring, ceiling systems and access flooring

This program combines apprenticeship training at the Interior Finishing Systems Training Centre along with Cooperative Education placement. It is offered in semester 2 and is open to Grade 12 graduating students with at least 26 credits. Students enroll in 4-credit Cooperative Education and earn up to 2 dual credits, along with a Level 1 designation.

PROGRAM CREDITS / CERTIFICATION:



At the end of this period, students will have hours of practical experience to position them for full or part-time employment in the skilled trade profession of Drywall, Acoustic Mechanic and Lather and to continue their apprenticeship.

TO QUALIFY:

- Be in your graduating year with at least 26 credits
- Be in good academic standing, including completion of all compulsory courses
- Have a strong interest and knowledge about a career in the construction industry
- Have some hands-on relevant work experience
- Have excellent attendance and demonstrates strong work habits and a positive attitude
- Have minimum 65% Grade 11 Mathematics

A Floor Covering Installer installs, replaces and repairs a variety of floor coverings in residential, industrial, commercial and institutional settings, using under cushion, carpeting, vinyl, resilient tile, sheet flooring, pre-finished, unfinished, engineered wood, laminate, seasonal carpeting and artificial turf. Specifically, a Floor Covering Installer:

- prepares floors by removing existing trim, flooring, and underlayments
- installs and repairs resilient tile, resilient sheet goods, gluedown carpets, carpet-1.4(r)-12.9(s r)-1.8(e)-5.8(5D2j3(e) 7.6) 6.7-2 Tom Br (e) 080521 fac 3le) 2.9 (a) in) ID 1e5-202EM

This program is a 2-year apprenticeship program at the Training Centre along with a Cooperative Education placement. Upon successful completion of the apprenticeship program, students may be supported with potential employment opportunities. (This is subject to employment availability)

- Earn 4 credits in Cooperative Education towards an Ontario Secondary School Diploma
- Earn 2 additional Dual Credits upon successful completion of “Level 1”
- Earn a “Level 1” Floor Covering Installer apprenticeship training designation



This program combines a Cooperative Education placement in Level 1 training at Studio 500. It is offered in Semester 2 and is open to students in their graduating year with a minimum of 26 credits.



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PLUMBER

performs some of the following

- repairs, and maintains fixtures in both commercial and residential settings
- cuts, and threads pipes using hand and power tools
- tests for leaks using air and pressure gauges
- estimates the work to be done
- interprets and drawings to the layout of plumbing water supply networks and drainage systems

PROGRAM COMPONENTS INCLUDE:

- 8 weeks of Cooperative education with a licensed plumber
- 8 weeks at Humber College or Sheridan College
- Program runs from April – June
- A registered training agreement is required

This program combines apprenticeship training at Humber College (Carrier Drive Campus) or Sheridan College (Davis Campus) along with Cooperative Education certified plumber. It is offered in semester 2 and is open to Grade 12 graduating students with at least 26 credits. Students enroll in 4-credit Cooperative Education and earn up to 2 dual credits, along with a Level 1 designation.



PROGRAM CREDITS / CERTIFICATION:

- Earn 4 credits in Cooperative Education towards an Ontario Secondary School Diploma
- Earn 2 additional Dual Credits upon successful completion of “Level 1”
- Earn a “Level 1” Plumbing apprenticeship training designation at Humber College or Sheridan College

At the end of this period, students will have hundreds of hours of practical experience to position them for full or part-time employment in the skilled trade profession of Plumbing and to continue their apprenticeship.

Upon confirmation of a successful interview at Humber/Sheridan College, students make contact with their home school semester 2 Cooperative Education teacher to look for a placement with a plumber who will agree to be an OYAP sponsoring employer.

TO QUALIFY:

- Be in your graduating year with at least 26 credits
- Have a strong interest and knowledge about a career as a plumber
- Have hands-on relevant work experience
- Have excellent attendance and solid work habits
- Have minimum 65% Grade 11 Mathematics

Candidates will be interviewed by a Humber/Sheridan College and a Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board faculty member in November / December / January. A limited number of spaces are available.



The Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board, The Ministry of Labour, Immigration, Training and Skills Development (MLITSD) and Humber College or Sheridan College offer this opportunity for students who want to pursue a career as a Plumber.

REFEF

This program combines instruction in high school and at George Brown College. This program also includes a Cooperative Education Placement in the Refrigeration and Air Conditioning industry with established residential air conditioning companies within the GTA. It is offered in Semester 2 and is open to students in their graduating year with a minimum of 26 credits.

TRUCK & COACH/ HEAVY DUTY EQUIPMENT TECHNICIAN

A truck and coach technician inspects, repairs and maintains commercial trucks, emergency vehicles, buses, road transport vehicles.

Technicians perform work on structural, mechanical, electrical and electronic systems.

Through Accelerated OYAP, students secure a truck and coach Cooperative Education placement while taking Level 1 apprenticeship in-class training at both Bramalea Secondary School (Mondays) and Centennial College (Fridays). In-class Apprenticeship Training runs from February until June.

PROGRAM COMPONENTS INCLUDE:

- In-class Cooperative Education community placement preparation
- First week of February start-up of Level 1 Apprenticeship Training at Bramalea S.S.
- Cooperative Education placement with a Truck and Coach company on Tuesday through Thursday
- Level 1 Apprenticeship In-class Training on Mondays (Bramalea S.S.) and Fridays (Centennial College)
- Program runs from February – June

This program in semester 2 combines Cooperative Education at the home school along with integrated Level 1 Apprenticeship Training at Bramalea Secondary School and Centennial College, Ashtonbee Campus.
